

Criteria for Academic Excellence Awards

Purpose: To recognise and honour students who achieve well across the breadth of their subjects. To promote students aspiring to academic excellence and provide additional motivation.

Criteria: A student will be eligible for an academic excellence award by:

- Achieving a minimum number of grades of an 'A' standard relative to the number of subjects they study in that year level.
- Having have no level of achievement below a 'C' standard.
- Where students have only studied a subject for one term due to year level swaps, ie. Year 8, we will count the cumulative score and treat the subject like one subject. Deputy Head of College will collate the data and determine those whose marks make them eligible for the award.

Specific Year Level Criteria

Year 7 – 9 (study 8 subjects)

- Students will need to achieve 5 "A"s and 3 marks of no lower than a C
- Technologies and Arts Rotation are cumulative. (Year 7 & 8 only)
- Christian Studies, Chapel, SL@M and Sport do not count

Year 10 (Study 7 subjects)

- Students will need to achieve a minimum of 4 "A"s and the remainder of their marks at no lower than a C- Standard.
- Chapel, SL@M and Sport do not count
- VET subjects cannot be included due to grading structure.

Year 11 & 12 (Study 6 subjects)

- Students will need to achieve 4 "A"s and have the remainder of their marks at no lower than a C- Standard.
- General subjects only will count towards the "A"s
- VET subjects cannot be included due to grading structure.
- Christian Studies, Chapel, SL@M and Sport do not count
